


### What is Letterland?

Letterland is a unique, phonics-based approach to teaching reading, writing and spelling to 3-8 year olds. The Letterland characters transform plain black letter shapes into child-friendly pictograms and they all live in an imaginary place called Letterland.

Simple stories about the Letterland characters, explain the full range of dry phonics facts so that children are motivated to listen, to think and to learn. These stories build to explain letter sounds & shapes, allowing children to progress quickly to word building, reading and writing.



Abstract letter shapes are transformed into motivating and engaging pictogram characters.



Singing, acting, drawing, writing, moving, speaking and building words by 'being' the letters are all important parts of learning. Here are just a few of the great range of Letterland techniques you can use to help your children learn how to read, write and enjoy language!

### Learn letter sounds

#### Sounds trick

START to say the character name, then STOP after the first sound:

#### Action trick

Reinforce the letter sound with a multi-sensory memory cue.

#### Alphabet songs

Sing the song to reinforce the letter sound:

"Clever Cat says 'c' in words,  
'c' in words, 'c' in words.  
Clever Cat says 'c' in words,  
and cuddles close to me."

#### Digraphs (change in sound)

Letterland uses interactive story-telling to explain new sounds and spelling patterns. These stories build on knowledge that children already have.

Clever Cat loves Harry Hat Man, but as soon as she finds herself next to him in a word his hairy hat makes her nose tickle. So whenever they come together in a word, all you can hear is her little sneeze, 'ch...'

There are short stories like this for all major recurring spellings.



### Learn letter shapes

#### Finger tracing

Air trace to reinforce letter shape and direction. Finger trace on a Letterland wall frieze, ABC book or Picture Code Cards.



#### Picture coding

Draw in the Letterland character on the plain letter shape to increase personal involvement with print and help eliminate inadvertent letter reversals.



#### Handwriting songs


Handwriting songs relate letter shapes and formation to parts of the body, making it fun and easy to learn to write correctly.

"Curve round Clever Cat's face to begin.  
Then gently tickle her under the chin."



#### Capital letter tricks (change in shape)

There's always a story to link lower and uppercase letter shapes. Clever Cat is so proud to start important words like names or places that she takes a deep breath and gets bigger.



When Harry Hat Man starts a name, he is so happy that he does a handstand with his hairy hat on!



### Word building

#### Speaking & listening

Letterland introduces new vocabulary for children to apply their new found phonics knowledge.




#### Blending & segmenting

The children become Letterlanders, then model blending, segmenting and building words for the class.



#### Rollercoaster trick

To help blend individual sounds into words use the multi-sensory trick of drawing a roller-coaster curve to blend the sounds together into a word.



### Advanced Spelling

#### All 44 sounds

Letterland goes much further than a-z! You can teach all the major recurring spelling patterns in the English language so your children can enjoy building sentences, reading books and fully participating in the world of literacy.
