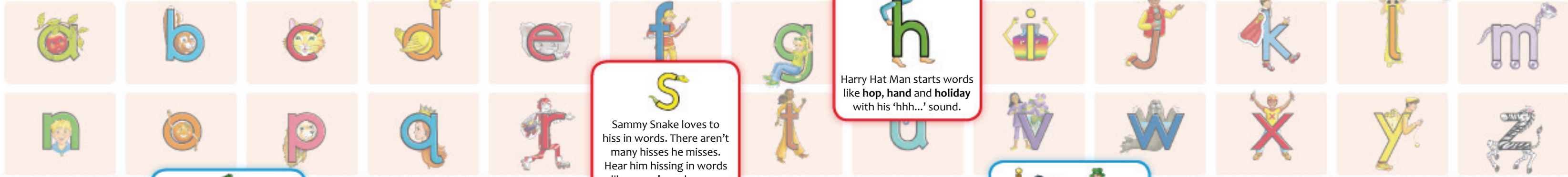




Start to say any Letterlander's name for the letter's correct sound!



Discover what happens when two letters meet and make a new sound.

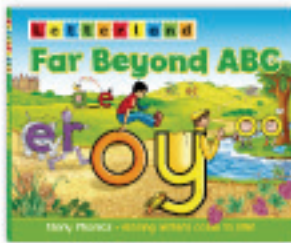


Watch out when you see an orange next to Walter Walrus. In many words his teasing gets both Oscar Orange and himself into trouble, so they both howl 'Ow!'.

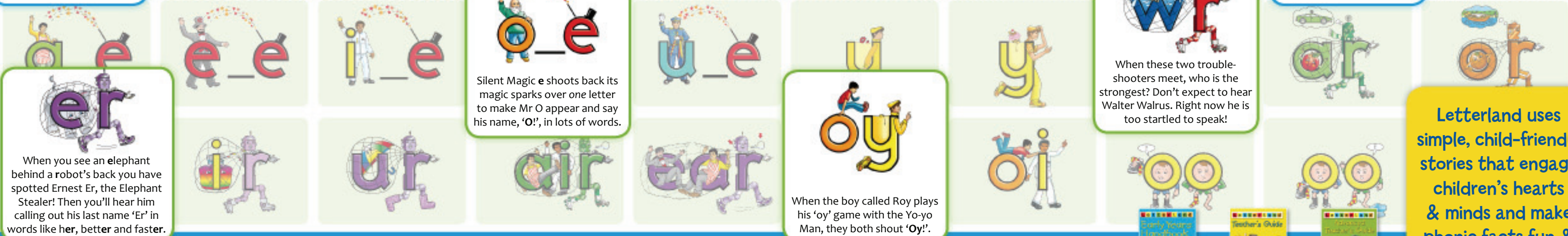
Whenever Sammy Snake starts to hiss loudly behind Harry Hat Man, the Hat Man turns back and says 'sh!' because he hates noise.
